Sarah arrives on her bike at Leinster House. The place is already buzzing. Coffee in hand, she heads straight up to her office.



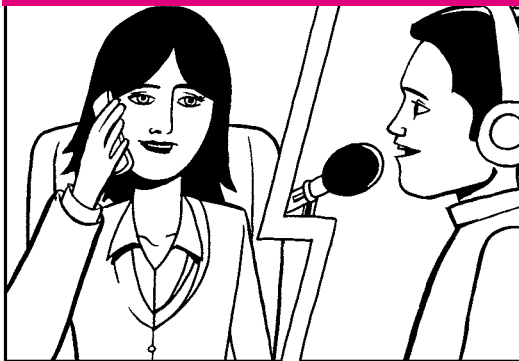
**10.30am**

**5.00pm**

In the Dáil, Sarah's party are putting forward a new law about speed limits. It's a good debate and the Minister for Transport agrees to take on board many of the points that Sarah and her colleagues are making. Outside the chamber, a journalist tells Sarah a clip of her speech will be on the late news.

**8.30pm**

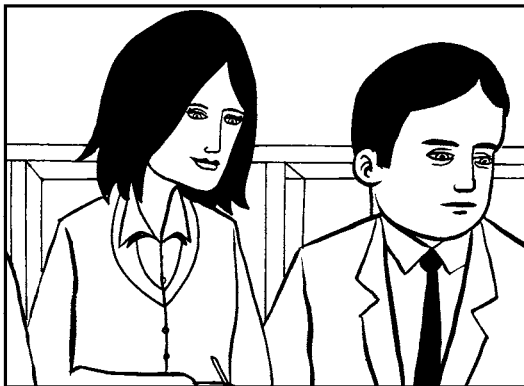
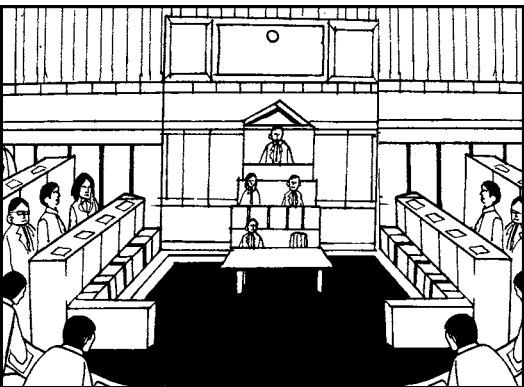
