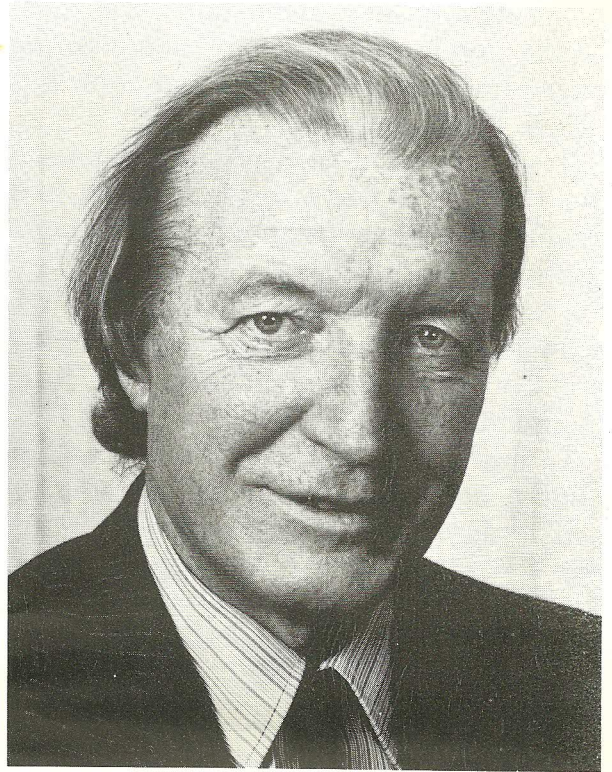

Rules Governing Procedure of the Youth Conference

PROCEDURE: The ruling of the Cathaoirleach, or in his absence the presiding Leas-Cathaoirleach, on all matters of procedure is final.

RESOLUTIONS: No resolution may be moved which does not appear on the Clár. A resolution may be moved only by a delegate from the Coiste Ógra which has submitted it, or which has submitted a similar resolution. If, on a resolution having been called, no delegate from the Coiste Ógra which submitted it, rises to speak, the Youth Conference will proceed to the next business, unless the Cathaoirleach decides to permit some other delegate to propose the resolution. Other delegates may speak to a resolution if allowed by the Cathaoirleach.

SPEAKERS: The proposer of a resolution and speakers to a resolution are allowed three minutes. The Cathaoirleach has the right to determine the order in which delegates may speak and shall endeavour to give preference to delegates who had not previously spoken on other resolutions. The Cathaoirleach may decline to allow a delegate to speak, if that delegate has already spoken on other resolutions. The Cathaoirleach may decline to allow a delegate to speak, if that delegate has already spoken twice on previous motions. Every delegate wishing to speak should take his or her place near the rostrum five minutes before he or she expects to be called on to speak. Every delegate on rising to speak must first announce his or her name and the name of his or her Constituency. A speaker must cease speaking on the striking of the Cathaoirleach's gong.

SIMILAR RESOLUTIONS: The decision on a resolution shall be held to determine the issue of any similar resolution.

DECISION: Decisions will be made by a show of hands. In the event of the Cathaoirleach being unable to decide the outcome of any vote, a count will be made by the Tellers.

RELEVANCE: If any delegate is directed by the Cathaoirleach to cease speaking on grounds of irrelevancy, he must do so forthwith. The Cathaoirleach's decision on matters of relevancy is final.

ARD COMHAIRLE REPORT:

SINCE the last National Youth Conference significant progress has been made in the organising and recruitment of young members to Fianna Fail.

It was felt by the delegates elected to the Ard Comhairle at the National Youth Conference in Limerick and by the Ard Chomhairle itself that steps would have to be taken immediately if Fianna Fail was going to maintain its large support among young people.

The National Youth Organising Sub-Committee of the Ard Comhairle was established. Along with the four youth delegates to the Ard Comhairle the following members of that body were appointed to the Sub-Committee: Cathal Brugha; Áine Brady-Kitt, Ray Walsh; Liam Lawlor and Bertie Ahern T.D. Bertie Ahern T.D. was appointed Chairman.

The Sub-Committee has held eleven meetings since its formation and has conducted an in-depth analysis of youth participation in Fianna Fail and has made comprehensive reports to the Ard Comhairle.

As a result of this activity it was decided to establish a committee of the Ard Comhairle as the central committee of Ogra Fianna Fail. This committee will be comprised of the four youth members of the Ard Comhairle, four other Ogra Fianna Fail members one from each Euro-constituency and others appointed by the Ard Chomhairle itself.

The Committee will be responsible for the affairs of Ogra Fianna Fail generally and securing an active unit of Ogra Fianna Fail in every constituency.

During the recent election a Youth Director of Elections was appointed in each constituency and the high degree of activity by young people in our campaign was very encouraging. Charles J. Haughey, T.D., Uachtaran Fianna Fail has stated on many occasions that the support he received from young people was one of the most uplifting parts of his nationwide tour during the election.

In October 1981 Fianna Fail appointed Aidan Eames as full-time National Youth Organiser and his task will be to organise Ogra Fianna Fail and increase recruitment to the party on a nationwide basis.

A number of very successful Youth Conferences have been held in constituencies throughout the country over the past year and the high quality of debate and original ideas is a very encouraging sign for Fianna Fail. Ball o Dhia ar an obair.

OGRA FIANNA FAIL — NEW YOUTH SCHEME:

1. Ogra Fianna Fail shall consist of all young members of Fianna Fail under 25 years of age.
2. It shall be open to young persons who wish to consider joining Fianna Fail to attend a meeting of Ogra Fianna Fail. Only members who have attended three meetings in the previous twelve months are entitled to vote.

COMHAIRLE CEANTAIR:

3. Each Comhairle Ceantair will have a Youth Committee to be known as the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Ceantair and shall consist of all cumainn members in the Comhairle Ceantair area under 25 years of age.
4. Each Coiste Ogra will elect its own Cathaoirleach-Runai and Cisteoiri and other officers as necessary.
5. It shall be the duty of members of Ogra Fianna Fail to encourage youth activity in their Cumann and to report youth progress in the Cumann area to the Coiste Ogra and the Comhairle Ceantair.
6. The Secretary and two other members of the Coiste Ogra (as selected by the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Ceantair) shall automatically be full members of the Comhairle Ceantair with voting rights.
7. Each Cumann; Comhairle Ceantair and Comhairle Dailcheantair shall appoint a Youth Officer who shall assist the Coiste Ogra in its work.

COMHAIRLE DAILCHEANTAIR:

8. (i) Each Comhairle Dailcheantair shall have a Youth Committee to be known as the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair.
(ii) The Cathaoirleach and Runai and one other of each Coiste Ogra Comhairle Ceantair will automatically be members of the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair.
(iii) Where a Constituency contains only one Comhairle Ceantair area, the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Ceantair shall exercise the powers and fulfil the functions of a Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair as defined in the Youth Scheme.
9. The Secretary and two other members of the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair (selected by the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair) shall become full members with voting rights of the Comhairle Dailcheantair.
10. The Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair shall keep the Comhairle Dailcheantair fully informed of youth activity within the area.

11. The Coiste Ogra Comhairle Ceantair and the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair must hold their meetings at least once a month.
12. It shall be the duty of the Chairman of each Coiste Ogra Comhairle Ceantair and Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair to call an Annual General Meeting for the election of their officers.
13. The Comhairle Ceantair and the Comhairle Dailcheantair must include a report from their respective Coiste Ogra as a standard item on the agenda.
14. Each constituency shall hold a Annual Youth Conference to be organised by the Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair in conjunction with the Comhairle Dailcheantair.

NATIONAL YOUTH CONFERENCE:

15. The Ogra Fianna Fail National Youth Conference shall take place annually. Delegates from each Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair shall be selected to attend as follows:
The Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair shall select twelve delegates at its Annual General Meeting to attend the National Youth Conference. In the constituencies where there is a University or Third Level Institution with a Cumann, then a further four delegates will be sent from that constituency and these four shall be drawn from the University or Third Level Institution Cumann.
16. The National Youth Conference shall elect by proportional representation four delegates to be full members of the Ard Comhairle, one from each Euro-Constituency.
There shall be a National Youth Committee of the Ard Chomhairle.
The Chairman and Secretaries of the Coiste Ogra Dailcheantair in each Euro-Constituency shall meet within one month of the National Youth Conference to elect a nominee, and these four nominees will be sent forward for ratification by the Ard Comhairle as members of the National Youth Committee.
17. The National Youth Committee shall call together for consultation at least twice a year the Secretary of each Coiste Ogra Comhairle Dailcheantair.
18. A meeting shall be held in each Euro-Constituency at least twice a year consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and one other representative from each Coiste Ogra Dailcheantair in that Euro-Constituency.
