SPECIAL NEEDS EDUCATION

TRUST OUR SCHOOLS

This government is failing our children.

All across the country children with additional needs are being left without the support they need. The waiting lists for Assessment of Needs and the Children's Disability Network Teams are endless with children waiting years for the support they need.

This situation is as bad in schools with not enough Special Ed Teachers, Special Needs Assistants or special classes. Now the government has made it even worse by changing the method for allocating all these resources.

In September many local schools will have less support available for children. This is not good enough. Cian and People Before Profit have helped initiate a campaign calling on the government to trust our local schools and allocate Special Ed teachers and SNAs based on need.

Dún Laoghiare Welcomes

Dún Laoghaire Welcomes is a coalition of trade union groups, community groups, activists and political parties in the greater Dún Laoghaire area. We were involved in forming this coalition to show a Cead Mile Fáilte to those seeking asylum living in our council area.

Our community has a long history of welcoming new arrivals. We have seen the positive impact that diversity and openness can bring to a community.

In recent months, Dún Laoghaire has welcomed people seeking asylum into the area. We have seen local groups reaching out to welcome our new residents, who are already beginning to integrate into the community.

As our community continues to grow, we must work together to push back against narratives that aim to divide us. The issues we face as a society are the result of ongoing state policy failure and we must work together for an Ireland for all.

Disability Rights are Human Rights

Disability activists are demanding the government ratify the Optional Protocol to the United Nations Convention on the Rights of People with Disabilities (UNCRPD).

Disability activists were recently successful in their campaign to scrap the proposed Green Paper bill. This highly regressive and invasive proposal would have tied the worth of a disabled person to their ability to work. Scrapping this bill was a great victory for the movement and People Before Profit will continue to work alongside the activists

for greater disability rights. This will include the ratification of the Optional Protocol.

Locally, People Before Profit has campaigned to expand accessibility to all public spaces. At present, the number of venues that are accessible is incredibly low, leaving members of our community excluded. In particular, when designing new buildings and projects, accessibility should be at the core of the project and not just treated as an afterthought.

When projects have accessibility as a feature rather than a core principle of the design, we get similar situations to the disaster at the Dún Laoghaire Baths. It is unacceptable that the plans for a public space can be changed once construction has begun that can result in members of the community being excluded.

In 2018 our councillor Dave O'Keeffe brought forward a motion on beach accessibility for wheelchair users. The initial motion was expanded upon into the beach accessibility programme. This includes the provision of beach wheelchairs and access to the water for wheelchair users.

Free, Frequent and 24 hour Public Transport

Despite the urgent need to rapidly increase our public transport network, Fine Gael, Fianna Fáil and the Greens have let our network stagnate. There has been no extension to the LUAS network in over 15 years. In 2017, Fine Gael sold half of the bus network in Dún Laoghaire to Go Ahead. This has led to worse conditions for bus drivers and a consequent deterioration of services. The level of late buses and services that simply do not show up is unacceptable.

If elected I will campaign to renationalise our transport services and move them away from a profit-led model. We need more buses and bus drivers on the road as well as further expansion of the LUAS and DART networks. People Before Profit is campaigning nationally to make public transport free and introduce 24 hour services. The fact our public transport shuts down before midnight inhibits our night time economy and increases the cost of living for everybody - especially for our essential shift workers.

Ecological Regeneration

Community Led Reforestation

The ecological and climate crisis is the defining issue of our century. Its impacts are already being felt through rising food prices, increasing water stress and natural disasters all around the world. Nationally, People Before Profit has committed to transformational policies to break Ireland's dependence on fossil fuels.

Locally, it is essential to protect Dublin's biodiversity and its ecosystems. If elected to the Council Cian will call on the council to develop Community Woodlands - a community led project to redevelop native woodlands in our local areas. Less than 1% of Ireland is covered by native forest and woodland.

People Before Profit have a proud record of campaigning to protect and expand native forests. In 2021 we successfully campaigned to prevent the sale of 39 acres of forest in Enniskerry. In 2013, People Before Profit was a key part of the mass movement to prevent the privatisation of Coillte - the State forestry company. Native woodlands and ecosystems are vital to reducing carbon emissions, maintaining healthy soils and protecting our water quality.


SCHEME REVAMP

The latest environmental survey by the Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council revealed that its largest source of carbon emissions comes from social housing. Most of the houses in Blackrock and across the constituency are over half a century old. This is due to poor insulation and the Council's neglect of social housing in the county for decades. Poor insulation means lower income families face higher energy costs in order to adequately heat their homes.

We are calling for a much more ambitious retrofitting scheme which will improve the living conditions of those in council housing, while also reducing their cost of living. This needs to be implemented broadly, and as a priority. Schemes which focus on small groupings or take years to implement are not solutions to the problems people face. For those on low incomes who own their own homes, the gap between government grants and the cost of retrofitting is too wide. We must demand bigger retrofit grants for those on low and modest incomes.

Additionally, the finance models used for non-council housing retrofitting must be restructured. Many of the current models, such as the installation of solar panels, require high upfront payments which many people cannot afford. This means that the people who would benefit the greatest from these schemes cannot avail of them.

We need to change how the schemes are run to allow gradual payback to the council, instead of applying for refunds from the council after paying out thousands.

STOP GAZA GENOCIDE

Free Palestine

For over six months Israel has inflicted death and destruction on the people of Gaza, killing more than 34,000 people, mostly children and women. This horror follows decades of ethnic cleansing, apartheid and occupation by Israel against the Palestinians, actively supported by the US, UK and EU governments. Irish people have shown solidarity with the people of Gaza and Palestine. Despite protests here in Ireland and across the world, the Irish government has refused to impose sanctions on Israel.

People Before Profit has been key to building support in Ireland. Cllr Melisa Halpin proposed a motion to the council supporting the international Boycott Divestment and Sanctions campaign, requesting that we should:

Impose a Boycott and Sanctions on the Israeli apartheid regime.

Prosecute Israel for the crime of genocide and other war crimes.

Defend Irish neutrality and ban US military aircraft and weapons from Irish airports.

Sports Builds Communities

Community-level sports and grassroots clubs are some of our communities' most important social networks, yet they are vastly underfunded. Across Europe, Ireland, in 2021, registered the lowest ratio (0.1% of GDP) devoted to 'recreational and sporting services' (Eurostat, 2023).

Our area has a chronic shortage of pitches, clubhouses and basic infrastructure. Every club we meet needs more funding, space, or basic support. Richard Boyd Barrett and Cllr Melisa Halpin have supported clubs like Monkstown Boxing Club, Granada, Sallynoggin-Pearse, Spring Hill Tennis and many others in their fights for clubhouses, pitches etc.

As People Before Profit, we are calling for:

- Doubling Government spending to meet, if not exceed, European averages.
- More provision of pitches for grassroots sports clubs.
- Better serviced facilities and upkeep through staffing and government financial support.

Space to Play

Well done to all those in the Clonkeen and Seapoint areas who have been campaigning for more play facilities. The Council has just announced two new playgrounds, one in Longford Gardens beside Salthill Dart Station and one-up in Clonkeen Park.

The slow roll-out of proper places to play for children and young people is not good enough. If elected Cian promises to campaign for proper resources to be provided for our community.

Blackrock Baths - STILL DERELICT

It is an utter disgrace that the Blackrock baths site is still derelict. The baths shut in 1987 and the council has let the site fall into dereliction eventually having to remove the iconic driving board as it became dangerous. People Before Profit, working with Save Our Seafront, has campaigned for years for this site to be redeveloped as a fully public amenity.

New plans for the site are due to come forward in the coming months, we believe the whole seafront area of the baths must be a fully public amenity. We do not want to see what is public land sold off for private development. If elected, Cian will campaign for proper public consultation with the community about the future of this site and will insist on a fully accessible, fully public development.

Dún Laoghaire Women's Refuge

After years of campaigning, Dún Laoghaire is finally getting its first women's refuge. While this is welcome, it has only been allocated 14 spaces instead o the proposed 28 spaces - which itself is half the number needed under the guidelines of the Istanbul Convention. If we are serious about protecting women and tackling gender-based violence, we need to do better. People Before Profit is calling for adequate refuge spaces in every county in Ireland.
